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Chong-Chang (Bruce) Lin, 63, of San Jose, California passed away on September 24, 2017 peacefully in his sleep surrounded by his immediate family. The funeral service will be held at 11:00 AM on Thursday, October 5, 2017 at Skylawn Memorial Park in Half Moon Bay. Pastor Samuel Hsiao of Seventh Day Adventist Church will be officiating. Burial will follow the funeral at Skylawn Memorial Park. Bruce was born in Taipei, Taiwan on April 25th, 1954. He graduated from Marquette University with his Masters in Engineering, 1981.
