A NNABEL STEIN 10/13/1919 – 6/17/2017 Annabel Stein (97) passed away peacefully at the Bayview Villa in San Carlos in the early morning of June 17, 2017. Annabel was born in Brooklyn, NY on October 13, 1919 to Elwood and Edith Stevenson. She grew up in Berkeley, CA where her father was superintendent of the California School for the Deaf. After graduating from Berkeley High School, she attended the University of Oregon and graduated from San Francisco State University. After raising her family, sons William and Robert and daughter Suzanne, in San Mateo and Burlingame, California; Annabel returned to SF State and earned her elementary teaching credential.
