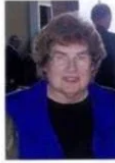

Barbara A. Madick 1931 – 2015 Barbara Ann (Maly) Madick, longtime resident of Redwood City, died Saturday, March 28, 2015 of heart failure. Barbara was born in Minneapolis on July 8, 1931, she was the second child of Dr. Henry W. and Ethyl R. Maly. She was raised in Colorado Springs and graduated from St. Mary's High School. She attended the University of Colorado and received a nursing degree and teaching certificate from St. Mary's College. Leavenworth, KS.
