Herman E. Schultz, 92, passed away peacefully on November 14, 2014 after a brief illness. Herman was born and raised in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. After his service in WWII, he was employed by Milprint, Inc. where he met and married his wife of 49 years, Rose. Accepting a job transfer, they moved their family to California in 1955 and settled in San Carlos. After leaving Milprint in 1970, he started his own business, Schultz's Cabinet Shop. Herman was very active in the community doing stage construction for the annual performances of the San Carlos Chicken's Ball, Kiwanis Show or the Children's Theater. Herman was predeceased by his wife, Rose.
