She continued her education, completing her bachelor’s and master’s degree at Sacramento State University, and doctoral degree at the University of San Francisco. “Dr. Garrett” is what we all had to call her! Dr. Garrett received her doctorate in International Multicultural Education.

Dr. Garrett loved learning and would always say she wanted to use her gifts and degrees to help the people. Linda was an amazing writer and had a way of telling you what you needed to know in simple language. Dr. Linda loved to tell parables – simple stories used to illustrate life lessons – and recently achieved one of her goals by publishing two pieces. The first is an article titled “It Is Well With My Soul: A Letter to My Nephew,” published in the International Journal of Human Rights Education. The second is a book chapter entitled, “A Cautionary Tale in the Elevating Marginalized Voices in Academe: Lessons to a New Generation of Scholars.”

She was baptized and began serving at an early age, where she was a longstanding member of the Bayview Missionary Baptist Church. She served as an usher, choir member, and administrator/fixer. 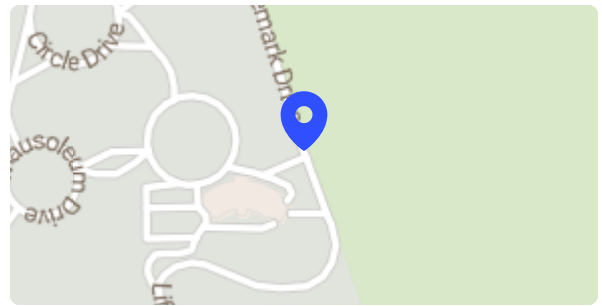

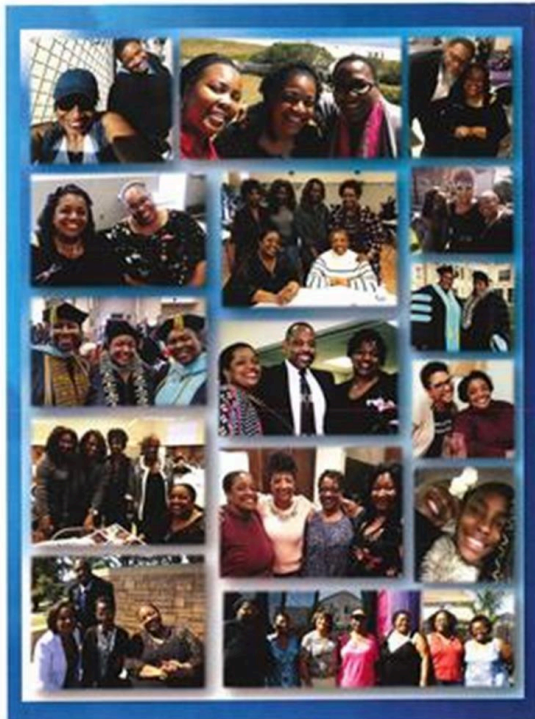

In the home where I belong.

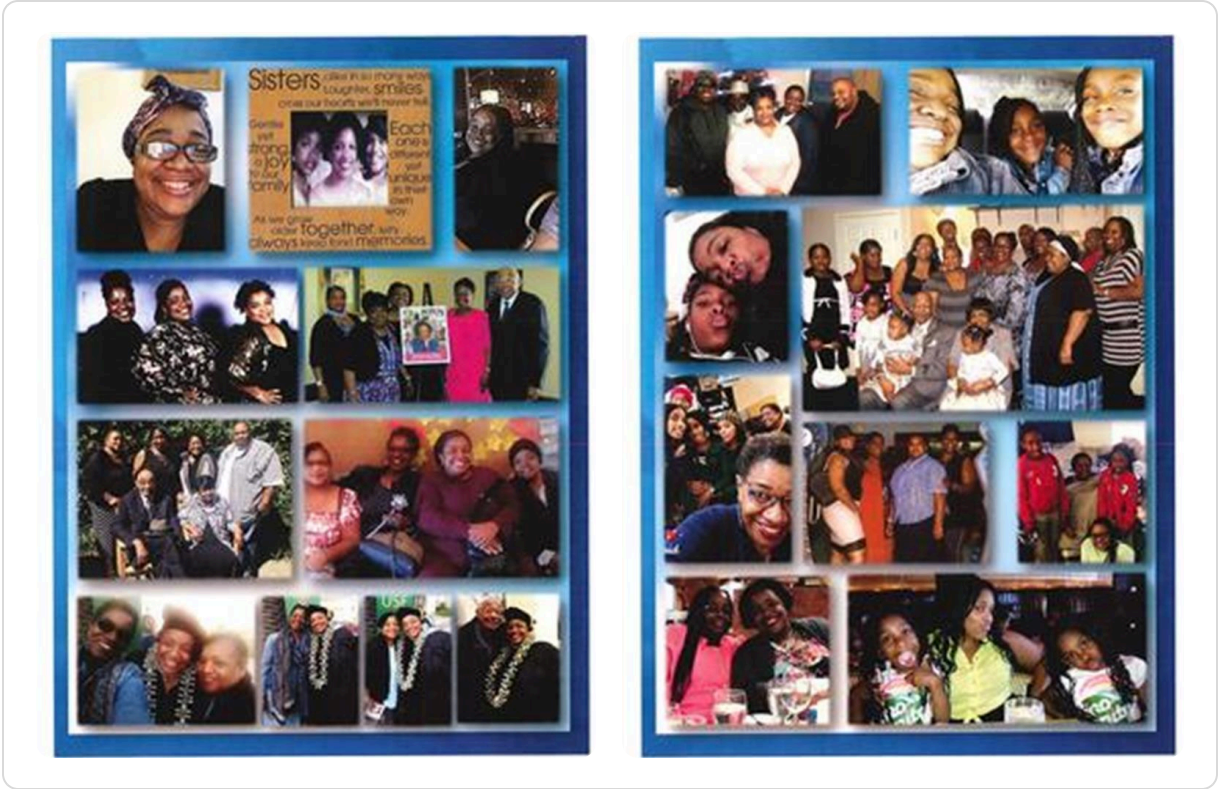
