On January 18, 1921 Linda was born to Swiss immigrants Pierina (mother) and Florindo (father) in Stockton, Ca. Her mother was a homemaker and her father was an owner/chef of “The Swiss Italian” restaurant. Often, Linda would help out at the restaurant along side her mother and brother, Mario, until her father’s passing when she was 12 years old.

She never dwelled on the hardships of losing her father at a young age or growing up in the Great Depression era. Quite the opposite; Linda always spoke positive of her past and passed on the importance of having a strong family who catches you when you fall, guides when you are lost, and restores hope when it is waning.

Linda graduated from St. Mary’s High School in Stockton. She took great pride in her high school. So much pride that she would root for St. Mary’s over her grandson’s high school. And that said a lot because she was always on Angelo’s side.

Eventually Linda left Stockton for a short time to live in Sacramento, Ca while she attended classes to learn clerical/bookkeeping skills. Once she finished her training, she moved back to Stockton to work as a bookkeeper for a local cement company and met her future husband, Henry.

On October 15, 1950, Linda married her soulmate, Henry Regalia, and became a full-time homemaker. In the late 1950s, Linda and Henry moved into an apartment in San Francisco, Ca following Henry’s job as a Brewmeister. Within a short stay at the apartment, they moved into their house in the Excelsior District where she resided for the remainder of her life.

In 1958 and after losing two baby sons (Mario, Richard), Linda gave birth to her son, Michael and three years later her daughter, Teresa.

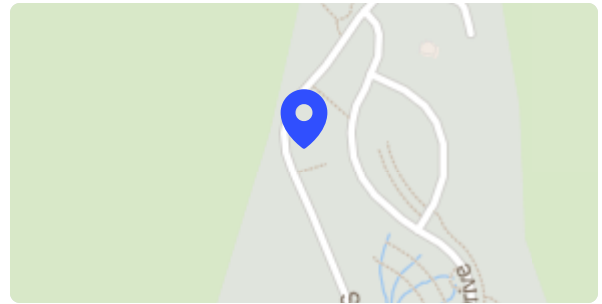
