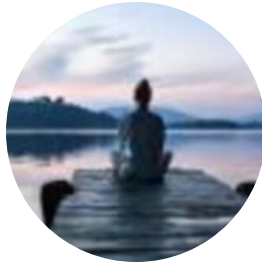

# Qiao Liang

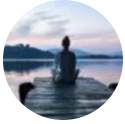
FEB 15, 1989 - JUN 13, 2023

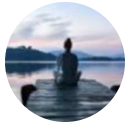

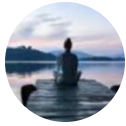

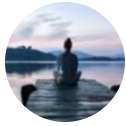
