## Losaline Evaleti Naeata

On Wednesday, June 12, 2024, Losaline Evaleti Naeata, loving daughter, niece, sister, aunt and mother passed away at the age of 38.

Losaline was born on October 29, 1985, in Palo Alto, California's Stanford Hospital to Sitiveni and the late Kelela (Tavake) Naeata. Losaline spent majority of her life in San Mateo, California. She went from elementary school at Sunnybrae, to middle school at Borel, and finally graduated from Aragon High School. (Go Dons!) She never married but was always surrounded by love.

After high school, Losaline would spend her life in various jobs, but would ultimately end up doing whatever she needed to serve her family. Most of her life was spent in service to others. Following in her late mother's footsteps, she was the go-to person for anything that needed to be done in her immediate and extended family. She led the charge in many family events and even though she was in pain, she would show up in any way possible.

Losaline was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. Throughout her life, she held various callings where she served the primary and youth children of the Peninsula 2nd Ward in San Mateo, California.

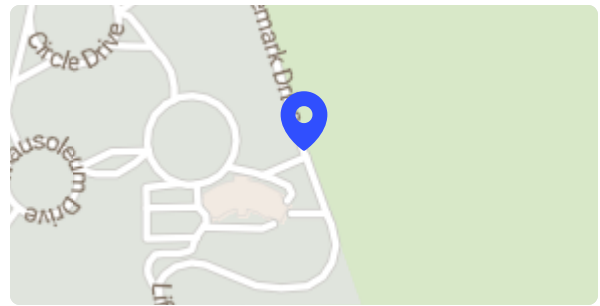
